Okayama University Science, Technology, and Innovation Creation Fellowship (OU Fellowship) [Type A] [Type B] Application Guidelines

Okayama University is calling for applications for the Okayama University Science, Technology, and Innovation Creation Fellowship [Type A] [Type B]. The OU Fellowship was established to assist students enrolling in the doctoral degree program and to cultivate young researchers capable of promoting Okayama University priority research fields with the intention of cultivating researchers capable of playing important roles in science, technology and innovation creation in Japan.

Okayama University will provide and distribute the living expenses and research budget as well as provide a wide range of approaches to improve research capability and support career paths.

1. Planned Enrollment Capacity

[Type A] Approx. 10 students [Type B] Approx. 10 students

2. Qualification Requirements

*Type A and B can be applied at the same time.

[Type A]

Applicants for the OU Fellowship Type A must fulfill the requirements listed below, be highly motivated to learn and concentrate on conducting research, and be younger than 30 years of age (younger than 32 years of age for applicants have taken time away from their academic pursuits to have and raise children or for other life events/ younger than 33 years of age for those who have enrolled in a medical field that requires clinical research). *As of April 1, 2022

However, those who fall under any of the following are excluded:

- (1) Members of the workforce*
- (2) Research Fellows (Young Scientists) of the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science

(3) Students from abroad receiving support through the Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship and scholarships from their own countries

* "Members of the workforce" here means (1) individuals engaged in a job that provides a regular income, (2) individuals who have retired from a job that provides a regular income, and (3) full-time homemakers. However, those who fall under category (3) may be qualified to apply depending on their individual circumstances.

Applicants for the OU Fellowship Type B must fulfill the requirements listed below, be highly motivated to learn and concentrate on conducting research.

Working individuals are eligible to apply for Type B. However, those who fall under any of the following are excluded:

(1) Students who have stable income that is sufficient to live on*

(2) Research Fellows (Young Scientists) of the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science

(3) Students from abroad receiving support through the Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship and scholarships from their own countries

3. Amount of Support /Duration

[Type A]

OU Fellowship Type A consists of research encouragement funding and a research budget. The amount to be provided is as shown below.

(1) Research Encouragement Funding: 1,800,000 yen per year (150,000 yen per month)

* In principle, funding is paid every two months.

* Research encouragement funding is provided for living expenses with the intention of helping to enable successful applicants to concentrate on their research.

(2) Research Budget: 600,000 yen per year

*To be distributed after submission of the research plan to the secretariat every academic year.

The period of distribution of the research encouragement funding and the research budget is the period, beginning from April 2022 in which the successful applicant is enrolled in the doctoral degree program (second semester), five-year doctoral degree program, or four-year doctoral degree program, which is three years in principle, and must be within the standard period of completion.

[Type B]

OU Fellowship Type B consists of research encouragement funding, a research budget and a research grant (category) which is additionally provided by the evaluations based on the proposal. The amount to be provided is as shown below.

(1) Research Encouragement Funding: 1,800,000 yen per year (150,000 yen per month) *In principle, funding is paid every two months.

* Research encouragement funding is provided for living expenses with the intention of helping to enable successful applicants to concentrate on their research.

(2) Research Budget: 400,000 yen per year

* To be distributed after submission of the research plan to the secretariat every academic year.

(3) Research Grant (Special Category): Up to 700,000 yen per year

This research grant is distributed to students who submitted their own proposals and received high evaluations in each academic year based on the submitted proposals.

*The research grant (special category) is <u>additionally provided</u> to OU Fellowship Type B recipients who submit their own approaches to increase their (1) international perspective, (2) research capability, and (3) career awareness. The period of distribution of the research encouragement funding, the research budget and the research grant (special category) is the period, beginning from April 2022 in which the successful applicant is enrolled in the doctoral degree program (second semester), five-year doctoral degree program, or four-year doctoral degree program, and must be within the standard period of completion.

[For Both Type A and B]

If the successful applicant takes a leave of absence from school, he/she will, in principle, no longer qualify for funding. However, if the recipient is expected to return to school to restart the research, the funding and budget may be temporarily suspended, and then restarted after the recipient returns to school.

[Notes (For Both Type A and B)]

In the case that the applicant for OU Fellowship Type B is the recipient of the following scholarships, the relevant scholarship amount shall be adjusted that the total annual amount of the scholarship and OU Fellowship will be maximum 2,400,000 yen.

- (1) Ohmoto Ikueikai Student Grant
- (2) Okayama University Scholarship to Support Students in Doctoral Degree Programs (Second Semester)
- (3) Other scholarship provided by a graduate school or division of Okayama University (excluding one-time award for enrollment)

4. Application Procedure (For Both Type A and B)

Students who have a desire to receive the OU Fellowship funding and budget must fill out and submit the following documents:

- Application Form
- Certificate of Estimated Income (For working individuals, etc. who have a regular income)
- Evaluation Form

Applicants must ask their individual advisors (planned) or someone familiar with their research to fill out and submit the designated Evaluation Form. (The Evaluation Form must be submitted directly to the secretariat by the person who completes the Evaluation Form.)

Please ensure sufficient time to complete the procedures for each form.

5. Selection Process (For Both Type A and B)

Successful applicants will be determined through document screening and online interview conducted by the OU Fellowship Screening Committee. The results of the document screening will be announced to the applicants by the end of October. Applicants who have passed the document screening will receive details regarding the online interview. The online interview is scheduled for early November. The results of the online interview will be announced to the applicants during November.

If a successful applicant declines the OU Fellowship, the Fellowship will be awarded to another applicant.

6. Selection Criteria (For Both Type A and B)

Okayama University awards OU Fellowships to applicants who are highly motivated to learn and conduct research, and they are expected to promote research in the priority fields designated by Okayama University and to play important roles in science, technology, and innovation creation in Japan in the near future. Applicants are comprehensively evaluated in the following areas:

- (1) The ability to set innovative research themes supported by creativity and deep insight
- (2) Exceptional ability to pursue their research
- (3) High communication ability

7. OU Fellowship Recipient Obligation (For Both Type A and B)

Successful OU Fellowship recipients are obligated to take research ethics education classes specified by Okayama University, concentrate on research activities based on their own research plans, and pursue the following items to form their particular career paths after the acquisition of the degrees: (Details will be announced following selection.)

(1) Submission of research progress reports for each academic year (September and March, in the designated OU format)

*Type B requires the recipients to report the progress of research supported by the research grant (special category).

(2) Periodical interviews with mentors (once every two months in principle)

(3) Participation in programs related to the improvement of research capability and support for career path (internship, meetings with companies, seminars, etc.)

8. Notes (For Both Type A and B)

(1) Successful OU Fellowship applicants are required to submit a pledge to concentrate on research activities, etc.

(2) Successful OU Fellowship applicants do not have an employment relationship with Okayama University; however, research support funding or research encouragement funding is listed as miscellaneous income under tax law and is considered taxable income. Therefore, successful applicants must file income tax returns.

(3) Research budgets must be used appropriately under the supervision of the university (advisor).
