Okayama University Science, Technology, and Innovation Creation Fellowship
(OU Fellowship) Application Guidelines

Okayama University is calling for applications for the Okayama University Science, Technology, and Innovation Creation Fellowship for FY2024. The OU Fellowship was established to assist students enrolling in the doctor's course and to cultivate young researchers capable of promoting Okayama University priority research fields with the intention of cultivating researchers capable of playing important roles in science, technology and innovation creation in Japan.

Okayama University will provide and distribute the living expenses and research budget as well as provide a wide range of approaches to improve research capability and support career paths.

1. Planned Enrollment Capacity

1st year student (3rd year student for five-year doctor's course): Approx. 20 students

2nd year student (4th year student for four-year doctor's course): few people

3rd year student (5th year student for four-year doctor's course): few people

4th year student: few people

2. Qualification Requirements

Applicants for the OU Fellowship for FY2024 must fulfill the requirements listed below, be highly motivated to learn and concentrate on conducting research.

~~Working individuals are also eligible to apply. However, those who fall under any of the following are excluded:~~

- (1) Students who have stable income that is sufficient to live on*
- (2) Research Fellows (Young Scientists) of the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science
- (3) Students from abroad receiving support through the Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship and scholarships from their own countries

* "Stable income that is sufficient to live on" here means 2,400,000 yen/year.

3. Amount of Support /Duration

OU Fellowship consists of research encouragement funding and research budget. The amount to be provided is as shown below.

(1) Research Encouragement Funding: 1,800,000 yen per year (150,000 yen per month)

* In principle, funding is paid every two months.

* **Research encouragement funding is provided for living expenses with the intention of helping to enable successful applicants to concentrate on their research.**

(2) Research Budget: Approx. 400,000 yen per year

* To be distributed after submission of the research plan to the OU Fellowship Office every academic year.

The period of distribution of the research encouragement funding and the research budget is the period, beginning from April 2024 in which the successful applicant is enrolled in the doctor's course, five-year doctor's course, or four-year doctor's course, and must be within the standard period of completion.

If the successful applicant takes a leave of absence from school, he/she will, in principle, no longer qualify for funding. However, if the recipient is expected to return to school to restart the research, the funding and budget may be temporarily suspended, and then restarted after the recipient returns to school.

[Notes]

In the case that the applicant for OU Fellowship is the recipient of the following scholarships, the relevant scholarship amount shall be adjusted that the total annual amount of the scholarship and OU Fellowship will be maximum 2,400,000 yen.

- (1) Ohmoto Ikueikai Student Grant**
- (2) Okayama University Scholarship to Support Students in Doctor's Course**
- (3) Other scholarship provided by a graduate school or division of Okayama University (excluding one-time award for enrollment)**

4. Application Procedure

Students who have a desire to receive the OU Fellowship funding and budget must fill out and submit the following documents:

- Application Form (Submit as PDF)
- Evaluation Form (Submit as PDF and must be submitted directly to the OU Fellowship Office by the person who completes the Evaluation Form)
- Certificate of Estimated Income (For working individuals, etc. who have a regular income)

Submission Deadline: **Monday, September 25, 2023 (17:00 JST) [No Exceptions]**

Applicants must ask their individual advisors (planned) or someone familiar with their research to fill out and submit the designated Evaluation Form. (The Evaluation Form must be submitted directly to the OU Fellowship Office by the person who completes the Evaluation Form.)

In principle, Application Form and Evaluation Form cannot be replaced once submitted, even if it is submitted before the due date. Please ensure sufficient time to complete the procedures for each form, and submit them in consultation with your individual advisor.

Please note that applications will not be accepted from applicants who have not submitted all documents by the submission deadline.

5. Selection Process

Successful applicants will be determined through document screening and online interview conducted by the OU Fellowship Screening Committee. The results of the document screening will be announced to the applicants by the end of October. Applicants who have passed the document screening will receive details regarding the online interview. The online interview is scheduled for early November. The results of the online interview will be announced to the applicants by the end of November.

If a successful applicant declines the OU Fellowship, the Fellowship will be awarded to another applicant.

6. Selection Criteria

Okayama University awards OU Fellowships to applicants who are highly motivated to learn and conduct research, and they are expected to promote research in the priority fields designated by Okayama University and to play important roles in science, technology, and innovation creation in Japan

in the near future. Applicants are comprehensively evaluated in the following areas:

- (1) The ability to set innovative research themes supported by creativity and deep insight
- (2) Exceptional ability to pursue their research
- (3) High communication ability
- (4) How you can contribute to research that falls under the "Okayama University Top Priority Research Fields".

7. OU Fellowship Recipient Obligation

Successful OU Fellowship recipients are obligated to take research ethics education classes specified by Okayama University, concentrate on research activities based on their own research plans, and pursue the following items to form their particular career paths after the acquisition of the degrees: (Details will be announced following selection.)

- (1) Submission of research progress reports for each academic year (September and March, in the designated OU format)
- (2) Periodical interviews with mentors (once every two months in principle)
- (3) Participation in programs related to the improvement of research capability and support for career path (seminars for presentations, transferable skill training, meetings with companies, etc.)
- (4) Report any changes in the information provided in the "Confirmation of Eligibility to Apply" section of the application form.
- (5) Register with "researchmap", a database-type researchers' directory operated by the National Institute of Science and Technology Agency (JST) (Added on September 1, 2023)

8. Notes

- (1) Successful OU Fellowship applicants are required to submit a pledge to concentrate on research activities, etc.
- (2) Successful OU Fellowship applicants do not have an employment relationship with Okayama University; however, research encouragement funding is listed as miscellaneous income under tax law and is considered taxable income. Therefore, successful applicants must file income tax returns.
- (3) Research budget must be used appropriately under the supervision of the university (advisor).
- (4) The OU Fellowship is a government program, and the OU Fellowship is provided on the premise that the research encouragement funding (equivalent to living expenses) and research budget provided by the fellowship will support "research activities in Japan," as determined by the government system. Therefore, please note that the fellowship cannot be provided to those who have not been able to come to Japan due to the status of the COVID-19 infection or other reasons.
- (5) If you become an OU Fellowship recipient, you will not be eligible for the "Return Exemption System for Outstanding Achievement" of JASSO's Type 1 (interest-free) scholarship.
